



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## Flathead Reservation

The Flathead Reservation, home to the Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribes, is the fourth largest reservation encompassing approximately 1.3 million acres in four Montana counties. Located west of the Continental Divide, the reservation area is comprised of diverse wildlife and landscape with the steep peaks of the lower Mission Mountains, the fertile Jocko Valley, Flathead Lake, as well as Kerr Dam, the National Bison Range, and Ninepipe National Wildlife Refuge. The major communities within the reservation include Arlee, Ravalli, St. Ignatius, Ronan, Pablo, and Polson. Major highway access is through U.S. Highway 93 and Montana Highways 35, 200, and 28. Air travelers will enjoy the remarkable scenery on the way from the Polson Airport, Missoula International Airport, and Glacier Park International Airport.

Approximately 65 percent of nearly 7,900 enrolled tribal members reside on the Flathead Reservation, including the Bitterroot Salish, upper Pend d'Oreille and Kootenai Tribes. The name the Salish people used to describe themselves is "Sqelixw" and the Kootenai call themselves "Ktunaxa."

The Confederated Salish and Kootenai Tribal Council, headquartered in Pablo, governs the tribes. It consists of ten council members from eight districts. Entities interested in doing business with the tribes or on the reservation should engage the Tribal Communications Office. Visitors should be mindful of tribal protocol, laws and regulations. Interested business parties are encouraged to become familiar with the Tribal Planning Department, the Indian Preference Office, the Division of Environmental Protection within the Natural Resources Department, as well as commercial property permitting and leasing

The tribal government employs approximately 1,200 people and infuses \$30 million annually into the local community through its payroll and another \$30 million to vendors. An affiliated family of S&K businesses including S&K Technologies Inc., S&K Aerospace, and S&K Global Solutions operates from a reservation-based headquarters. Other tribal ventures include S & K Electronics, Best Western KwaTaqNuk Resort, Gray Wolf Peak Casino, and Eagle Bank. Other major employers are Salish Kootenai College, St. Luke's Hospital and Health Care Network, St. Joseph's Hospital, Lake County government, and various public schools. Private sector business growth is supported by S&K Holding Company, Sovereign Leasing and Financial, and the Tribe's Economic Development Department.

The tribal government makes considerable efforts to support a diversified economy by providing training and resources for tribal members. Instrumental to that effort are the Tribes' Department of Human Resource Development, Vocational Rehabilitation, and Salish Kootenai College Job Mentoring Programs. The Kicking Horse Job Corp provides workforce development opportunities through career, technical, and academic training programs. Salish Kootenai College promotes community and individual development by providing quality postsecondary educational opportunities that meet the unique needs of the Native American population. The College is accredited at the bachelor degree level and the average annual college enrollment is over 1,112 students. 

CDP = Census designated places. CDPs are delineated for each decennial census as the statistical counterparts of incorporated places. CDPs are delineated to provide data for settled concentrations of population that are identifiable by name but are not legally incorporated under the laws of the state in which they are located. The boundaries usually are defined in cooperation with local and tribal officials. These boundaries, which usually coincide with visible features or the boundary of an adjacent incorporated place or other legal entity boundary, have no legal status, nor do these places have officials elected to serve traditional municipal functions.

**Household Income:** This includes the income of the householder and all other individuals 15 years or older in the household, whether they are related to the householder or not. Because many households consist of only one person, average household income is usually less than average family income.


