


Workforce Size in Blaine County


Top Employing Industries, 2023

76.7% of Blaine County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 84.2%.


Outmigration in Blaine County

13.0% of workers in Blaine County **work from home**, greater than the statewide average of 10.6%.


Net Migration as a Percent of the Population by County


Population by Age Group and Participation in Labor Force
