


#### **Workforce Size in Broadwater County**

#### Top Employing Industries, 2023




Percent of Total Employment

**58.8%** of Broadwater County's population over 15 participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 63.0%.


**83.2%** of Broadwater County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, similar to the statewide rate of 84.2%.

Broadwater County had **1,430** more people migrate in than out since 2020, **18**% of the county's population- the highest % increase in the state.


**11.7%** of workers in Broadwater County **work from home**, similar to the statewide average of 10.6%.


#### Population by Age Group and Participation in Labor Force
