


Workforce Size in Dawson County


Top Employing Industries, 2023

63.4% of Dawson County's population over 15 participates in the labor force, similar to the statewide rate of 63.0%.


84.2% of Dawson County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, same as the statewide rate of 84.2%.

Stable Population in Dawson County


Dawson county has **had the same number** of people move in as out since 2020.


