


Workforce Size in Gallatin County

Top Employing Industries, 2023



Labor Force Participation

71.0% of Gallatin County's population over 15 participates in the labor force, above the statewide rate of 63.0%.

88.2% of Gallatin County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, above the statewide rate of 84.2%.


Populations Increase in Western Montana

Gallatin County had **7,000 more people move in** than out from 2020 to 2023, about **6%** of the population.


14.5% of workers in Gallatin County **work from home**, greater than the statewide average of 10.6%.

Net Migration as a Percent of the Population by County




