


Workforce Size in Golden Valley County

Top Employing Industries, 2023




Percent of Total Employment

53.1% of Golden Valley County's above 15 population participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 63.0%.


83.3% of Prairie County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, similar to the statewide rate of 84.2%

Golden Valley County is estimated to have a similar share of workers who work from home as the statewide average of 10.6%.


Net Migration as a Percent of the Population by County


Population by Age Group and Participation in Labor Force
