


#### Workforce Size in Jefferson County


## **Top Employing Industries, 2023**

**57.5%** of Jefferson County's population over 15 participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 63.0%.


**82.9%** of Jefferson County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, similar to the statewide rate of 84.2%.

# Populations Increase in Southwest Montana


Jefferson County had **1,300 more people move in** than out from 2020 to 2023, about **10%** of the population.

**9.7%** of workers in Jefferson County **work from home**, similar to the statewide average of 10.6%.


# Net Migration as a Percent of the Population by County

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


Population by Age Group and Participation in Labor Force
