


Workforce Size in Mineral County


Top Employing Industries, 2023

Labor Force Participation

52.4% of Mineral County's population above 15 participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 63.0%.

82.6% of Mineral County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, similar to the statewide rate of 84.2%.

Population Growth in Northwest Montana


Mineral County had **800 more people migrate in** than out since 2020, 16% of the county's population, the **2nd largest** percent increase in the state.

9.6% of workers in Mineral County **work from home**, similar to the statewide average of 10.6%.


Net Migration as a Percent of the Population by County



Fast Rising Home Prices

Home prices have risen by **85%** from 2020 to 2024 in Mineral County, the **4th most** in the state
