


Workforce Size in Missoula County

Missoula County had **4,700 more people move in** than out from 2020 to 2023, about **4%** of the population.


10.3% of workers in Missoula County **work from home**, similar to the statewide average of 10.6%.


Population by Age Group and Participation in Labor Force
