

Top Employing Industries, 2023




Percent of Total Employment

56.5% of Prairie County's above 15 population participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 63.0%.


81.6% of Prairie County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 84.2%

Mixed Population Changes in Eastern Montana


Prairie County had **45 more people move in** than out from 2020 to 2023, about **4%** of the population.

Prairie County is estimated to have a greater share of workers who work from home than the statewide average of 10.6%.


Net Migration as a Percent of the Population by County


