- 9.8% of the population with income below the federal poverty level (below the state average of 12.4%).




Workforce Size in Ravalli County


Top Employing Industries, 2023

56.4% of Ravalli County's population over 15 participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 63.0%.


82.2% of Ravalli County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 84.2%.

12% of workers in Ravalli County **work from home**, similar to the statewide average of 10.6%.


Net Migration as a Percent of the Population by County


Population by Age Group and Participation in Labor Force
