


#### Workforce Size in Richland County

### **Top Employing Industries, 2023**




#### Percent of Total Employment

**66.8%** of Richland County's population over 15 participates in the labor force, above the statewide rate of 63.0%.


**87.0%** of Richland County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, above the statewide rate of 84.2%.

Richland County had **383 more people move out** than in from 2020 to 2023, about **3%** of the population.


**4.8%** of workers in Richland County **work from home**, below the statewide average of 10.6%.


