


Workforce Size in Wibaux County

58.1% of Wibaux County's population over 16 participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 63.0%.


83.3% of Wibaux County's prime working age population (25 to 54 years old) participates in the labor force, below the statewide rate of 84.2%.

12.1% of workers in Wibaux County **work from home**, above the statewide average of 10.6%.


Net Migration as a Percent of the Population by County

Population by Age Group and Participation in Labor Force


